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












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#### Welcome to our pantomime!

#### Rapunzel - A Deddington Players Pantomime Written by Steve Moss

#### From the Director

I'd like to welcome you to our panto and thank you for coming to support this fantastic annual community event.

Preparations began for this panto right at the end of the last one, when Steve scurried off to a darkened room and emerged months later, blinking at the sunlight, with the hilarious script you're about to be treated to. As a cast and crew, we all came together in September to start rehearsing and preparing for this year's panto. It's a special time when we all return to the Windmill, break open the script, laugh raucously (at the jokes), take a few sharp intakes of breath (again, at the jokes), cheer (or frown) at the songs, looked wideeyed at the dance moves, wince at the stage directions... and dive in.

Our 44-strong cast this year is drawn from across the Deddington local community and beyond. 28 of them are children, almost all of whom have been a part of our panto before. Performing in front of a large group of people is not for everyone, and it's not easy no matter how old or seasoned an actor you are; every one of the young actors, singers and dancers in our company has been fantastic to work with. The 16 adults in the cast, meanwhile, have approached the panto with their usual high level of dedication, humour and support, which makes a huge difference to everyone's enjoyment of the whole process. I'm so grateful to them all for making my job a very pleasurable one.

It's certainly not all about the luvvies though. We are blessed with a specialist backstage team (again, 44 of them!) which has worked tirelessly behind the scenes to get everything ready - from our talented



set painters and prop makers to our super-slick stage managers and stage crew, to sound and lighting supremos, sublime costume designers and make-up artists... not to mention the wonderful front-of-house team which has welcomed you this evening. We also have a crack team of runners who wrangle the cast into place just in the nick of time; Kelly (our musical director) who passionately brings the songs to life; and Sarah, whose dazzling choreography has made the children spring into life and made the adults' knee joints spring out of place. Without these people, we would not have a panto.

Finally, I must pay tribute to the tireless workhorse who is Mr Panto himself – our Chair, producer and writer par excellence, Steve Moss. His commitment to Deddington Players and to our panto is remarkable. Away from his glamorous on-stage persona, he has put in a huge amount of very unglamorous work this year and we are so very lucky to have him.

The first twelve scripts were written by Molly Neild and Jean Flux, and we have returned to creating our own scripts.

Through our productions we have supported several local charities, including Katherine House, the Thursday Club, Space2Learn and the Holly Tree Club.
